Minutes of Meeting of the Derry City and Strabane District Council held in the Guildhall, Derry on Thursday 31 May 2018 at 4.00 pm

C167/18 Notice and Summons of Meeting

The Mayor read the Notice and Summons for the Meeting.

Councillor Carlin entered the meeting at this point.

C171/18 Bereavement

The Mayor welcomed Alderman M Hamilton to the meeting after her recent bereavement. He then read out a short statement on behalf of the Hamilton family thanking Members for their support at this time.

C172/18 Delegation to China

The Mayor gave an update on the recent delegation from Derry City and Strabane District Council to Dalian, China. He stated that the visit had been a great success with the signing of an agreement with the city of Dalian which would further develop their business relationships, particularly in education, technology and tourism. He stated that the delegation had been invited to meet with the Party Secretary of Dalian, and that this was the first

time a foreign delegation had been offered such an invitation. He described how the successful meeting was an affirmation of the previous meetings and discussions with the people of Dalian and that the meeting with the Party Secretary had also received coverage on the television news network in China. He added that the visit to Dalian was extremely fruitful and worthwhile and would be extremely beneficial to business and tourism in the North West region.

C172/18 Confirmation of the Open Minutes of the Meeting of the Derry City and Strabane District Council held on Thursday 26 April 2018

The Minutes of the Open Meeting of Derry City and Strabane District Council held on 26 April 2018 (C127/18-C157/18) were submitted. On a matter of accuracy, Alderman McClintock referred to C139/18, the Minutes of the Governance and Strategic Planning Committee meeting. She stated that she did not Second the minutes of the meeting.

On a further matter of accuracy, Councillor Robinson referred to C143/18 and stated that it was Councillor Donnelly who had been nominated to sit on the Adverse Weather Working Group. It was agreed that the minutes would be amended accordingly.

Councillor Hastings Moved, Councillor McMahon Seconded and the Council.

C173/18 Matters Arising

C174/18 Displays Bearing the Council Logo (C137/18)

Councillor Gallagher asked if there had been any update on the decision to send a delegation to the Secretary of State to demand the release of Tony Taylor.

The Chief Executive reported that correspondence had been received on 29 May 2018 from the Rt. Hon Karen Bradley MP, Secretary of State for Northern Ireland. He then read the details of the letter and advised that a copy would be circulated to Members.

Councillor Gallagher stated that Council was a democratic body and expressed shock at the news that the Secretary of State was refusing to meet with Elected

Representatives regarding the incarceration of one of its citizens. He added that Elected Members should not only be concerned but appalled at the decision. Councillor Tierney echoed the sentiments expressed by Councillor Gallagher. He referred to the correspondence from the Secretary of State, which stated; *'Every prisoner released on licence has an obligation to act within the terms of their licence. If they fail to do so then they can be returned to prison to serve out the remainder of their prison sentence'*. He stated no reason had been given on how Mr Taylor had failed the terms of his licence which was a major concern for Mr Taylor's family. He emphasised that Mr Taylor should be given the opportunity for a fair and open trial and that if no evidence could be provided, he should be released immediately. He concurred with Councillor Gallagher and expressed his shock that the Secretary of State had refused to meet with Elected Members. He stated that Mr Taylor has been incarcerated for almost two years and that there had been various campaigns to demand his release.

Councillor Duffy stated that Elisha McCallion MP had met with the Secretary of State and the British Prime Minister on a number of occasions and had raised the issue regarding Mr Taylor, but to no avail. She emphasised the importance of demanding answers from the Secretary of State on the matter.

C175/18 Condemnation – Attack on Councillor Campbell's Home (C140/18)

Councillor Fleming stated that he wished to make a point of order regarding the 'spurious allegations' against Sinn Fein and Council Officers from Councillor Donnelly following the arson attack on Councillor Campbell's car. He stated that comments had also been made against Sinn Fein in relation to an independent Councillor in Donegal which had been exposed as fabrication. Councillor Fleming then asked Councillor Donnelly to retract the allegations.

In response, Councillor Donnelly reiterated his comments where he had stated that the attack on Councillor Campbell's car was wrong, however he would stand over the comments that he had previously made.

C176/18 Establishing an Adverse Weather Working Group (C143/18)

Councillor Reilly stated that he had contacted Council Officers regarding the recent spell of warm weather asking them to contact businesses throughout the City and District to ensure that employees were working in an appropriate environment. He requested that the matter be included on the agenda for the next meeting of the Adverse Weather Working Group which was scheduled to take place on 20 June. He further requested that Council work with the Health and Safety Executive (HSE) to relay information to employers via the Council website and social media to advise them that they must provide a safe and suitable workplace for employees. He suggested that any advice provided by the HSE be circulated to Members to enable them to offer advice to their constituents.

Matters Arising

C178/18 To Discuss the Ongoing Situation in Palestine (SC26/18)

Alderman Hussey stated that in his opinion, the meeting had been called for a specific purpose, however the meeting had went beyond that specific purpose but had been permitted to continue.

The Mayor stated that legal opinion had been given on the matter and that Alderman Hussey's position was therefore erroneous.

In response to Councillor Gallagher's comments regarding the lighting up of Council facilities in Palestinian colours, the Mayor stated that he would verify

if information had been sent to Members to notify them when the lights would be switched on.

Councillor Donnelly asked for an update on the report regarding Council investments in Israeli companies. He referred to historic issues regarding Raytheon and the Legacy Derry City Council and that lessons needed to be learned from events that occurred at that time. He stated that the present Council, due to investigations and recommendations, had made huge strides in restoring public confidence. However, he felt that with Council investing in Bezeq Israeli Telecom, there was a potential for Council's reputation to be destroyed as the company had faced allegations of corruption. He stressed that Council should treat the matter with the utmost urgency given the ongoing genocide against the Palestinian people.

Alderman Devenney referred to the proposal he had previously made regarding the lighting up of Council facilities in the colours of the American flag as a mark of sympathy to those who had been recently killed at a school in Texas. He stated that he had been advised to raise the issue at another meeting and therefore proposed that Council facilities be lit up in the colours of the American flag. He felt that it was a tragedy that should not have happened and should be recognised.

The Mayor advised Alderman Devenney that the meeting was dealing with matters arising from the Special Meeting of Derry City and Strabane District Council and to submit his proposal through the appropriate channels.

In response to Alderman Hussey's query, the Mayor clarified that the proposal put forward by Alderman Devenney had been recorded in the minutes, however he had ruled that it would not be accepted.

Matters Arising

C185/18 Newtownstewart – Anti Social Behaviour (BC104/18)

Alderman Hussey reported that a multi-agency meeting had taken place which had been attended by all parties from the Newtownstewart area including the PCSP. He felt that the meeting had been worthwhile and hoped that Council would continue their support on the matter going forward.

Councillor McGuire stated that he had also attended the meeting which he found to be very positive. He suggested that more input was needed from Council

particularly from the Health and Community Directorate and also from the Justice system to deal with anti-social issues in the Newtownstewart area.

e Monthly Environment and Regeneration Committee held on Wednesday 16 May 2018

The Minutes of the Environment and Regeneration Committee held on 16 May 2018 (ER96/18 – ER118/18) were submitted.

C187/18 Sandbag Protocol Flooding Schemes (ER109/18)

Councillor Donnelly requested an update regarding the establishment of the Adverse Weather Working Group. The Chief Executive stated that he would liaise with the Lead Assurance Officer on the matter.

Councillor Reilly stated that he had already informed Members that the working group was scheduled to meet on 20 June to address any issues regarding past events and the recent spell of warm weather.

Councillor Donnelly stated that confusion had arose regarding notification of the meeting of the Adverse Weather Working Group due to an inaccuracy in the minutes and the invitation had therefore been sent in error to Councillor Robinson.

C188/18 The Gaza Attack (ER99/18)

Alderman Hussey referred to his previous comments on the need to establish a mechanism through which proposals to light up Council facilities were agreed. He then informed Members that 18-24 June, was Cystic

Fibrosis Awareness Week with the Cystic Fibrosis Trust holding a 'Wear Yellow Day' demonstration at City Hall Belfast on 22 June. He stated that Members would have received information on the event and encouraged them to attend. He further stated that Council should be officially represented at the Wear Yellow Day at Belfast City Hall.

Alderman Hussey Moved, Seconded by Councillor Dobbins

After voting by a show of hands the proposal was unanimously carried and the Council

In response to Alderman Devenney's request that his previous proposal be addressed, the Mayor stated that he had already made a decision on the matter.

Councillor McCauley stated that if Council buildings were lit up for every tragedy in America it would happen all year round. He suggested that Council buildings be lit up in the colours of the Santa Fe High School flag as a mark of respect for the 10 people who had been killed.

Alderman Thompson requested clarity on the matter. He asked the Mayor to state the reason for rejecting the proposal put forward by Alderman Devenney.

The Mayor outlined that Alderman Devenney had made the proposal under a different issue to what was being discussed at the meeting. He advised Alderman Devenney to submit his proposal to Council using the correct procedures.

Alderman Thompson stated that, in his opinion, the Mayor was in breach of his authority and he would seek external legal opinion on the matter.

In response to Alderman Warke's request to second the proposal put forward by Alderman Devenney, the Mayor reiterated that he had made a decision on the matter. Alderman Hussey stated that for clarification purposes, he had raised his proposal through the matter for lighting up Council facilities. He stated that as a Council body there should be agreement on occasions when facilities would be lit up.

The Mayor stated that Alderman Hussey had sought permission to put forward his proposal before the meeting to support Cystic Fibrosis Awareness Week.

She asked if there were ways that Council could continue to support the Pioneer Community in the absence of provision from the Trust.

The Director of Health and Community stated that they would request a formal update from the Pioneer Community on their position and report back to a future Health and Community Committee meeting.

Councillor O'Reilly said that Members had received an invitation to attend a future conference regarding the ACE Programme and asked that the invitation be extended to Council Officers to give them an awareness of the initiative.
