1 Purpose of Report/Recommendations

- 1.1 To gain Members consent to name a new access road constructed as part of the A6D2D Dualling scheme.

2 Background

- 2.1 A request has been received from the occupiers of dwellings with the former addresses of 232, 234 & 234A on the old alignment of the Glenshane Road for Council to provide a street name for a new permanent roadway constructed to serve their properties as part of the A6D2D dualling scheme.

3 Key Issues

- 3.1 Prior to the construction of the new A6 from Derry to Dungiven, the properties at 232, 234 and 234A Glenshane Road, Derry had direct access to the Glenshane Road. This section of the Glenshane Road now been replaced with the new A6 dual carriageway, and the occupants now have a 5-mile diversion from Tamnaherin Road to Ervey Road, where the new access road adjoins. This change has caused significant problems with deliveries and access for emergency services to the said properties.
- 3.2 Access to the new road is from a junction with Ervey Road, (which will eventually be extended to Tamnaherin Road) and will be suitable for all vehicular traffic before the end of September 2021. (See Appendix 1&2).
- 3.3 The existing addresses of 232, 234 & 234a Glenshane Road, are no longer relevant for these properties as they cannot be accessed directly from the Glenshane Road. There is a shortage of postal numbers available to address these properties as Ervey Road. The creation of a new street name and postal numbers would be the most appropriate solution to this difficulty.
- 3.4 DfI Roads have confirmed they have no objections to a new street name being created for this new access road and will be adopting the road on completion.
- 3.5 The occupants of 232, 234 & 234a Glenshane Road have proposed that the new street is named **Burntollet Road**. This name complies with the current street naming policy as it pertains to the adjacent Burntollet River and former Burntollet Bridge.
